SOME ONE WAS PRAYING FOR ME (I believe in prayer)

I came from a large family, having six brothers and six sisters of which one was a priest and two were nuns. Being from a small town everyone knew everyone.

In 1929 after a tonsillectomy, for some reason they had trouble stopping the bleeding. They did and I recovered. "Some was praying for me."

In 1937 I had pneumonia, it was touch and go but "Some one was praying for me."

During WWII we sailed to Australia and later flew to New Guinea, safely,
"Some one was praying for me."

When we got to New Guinea the perils were greater. One day when my Recon. Sgt. and I were trying to get the range etc. for our mortars, we had to crawl in the jungle to get close enough to see our target. When we got back my Sgt's pack was in shreds from sniper fire, mine was OK.
"Some one was praying for me."

Another day, during an air raid, as the planes approached, their 50 caliber machineguns opened fire. I was facing the planes and the bullets landed on both sides of me. "Some one was praying for me."

While we were attacking one day, two Sgts, from "C" company came to me for help as they had lost all their officers. While we were talking they both were shot in the head by a sniper. I was untouched.
"Some one was praying for me."

Even with all the prayers, I still got wounded. But alive. "Some one was praying for me."

While flying over the mountains of New Guinea to Port Moresby, we heard by radio that our hospital was being bombed. I was later told that the bomb had landed on the bed that I had occupied the night before. "Someone was praying for me."

During my hospitalization in Port Moresby, I don't know if it was Malaria or an infection from shell fragments, I ran a temperature of 108 degrees. The doctor said that I was supposed to die at 106 degrees. "Someone was [r]aying for me."

When in the hospital in Port Moresby, I awoke from what I thought was a nap. The doctor asked me if I would like something. I told him I would like a bottle of beer! With that reply he told the nurse let's do something for him, he is not going to die." I then started getting better. Before I was taken to Australia a nurse told me that I had been in a coma for three days and they were standing by me waiting for me to die. "Someone was praying for me."

After thirteen major operations and tours of thirteen different hospitals I was finally sent back to duty in April 1944. "Someone was praying for me."

As a civilian in March 1948 I was again hospitalized, because of kidney stone. The doctor did not why but I was having a high temperature. He told my wife to call my family, as he didn't think I would make it. After I told him to treat me for Malaria, I got well. "Someone was praying for me."

By the year 2000 most of my siblings are gone, save for one sister, Their families all know their "Old Uncle Bill." Having been a Knight of Columbus for over 64 years, Serran about 35 years, plus the church involvement and many friends, the prayers go on! In December when the doctor recommended heart surgery, i was not afraid. After the operation the doctor told me that my old valve was in such bad condition, that without the surgery and new valve, I would have been dead in about three days. "Someone was praying for me."

In 2002 I had a bad fall damaging my spine. Doctors told me then that I may not walk again. After months of therapy, I can walk with a walker, More prayers.

Since my fall, I still have incidents: one year a bout with salmonella. After 2 airplane trips I have had sessions of congestive heart failure, and 2 episodes of bronchitis. I keep surviving. Just too many prayers?

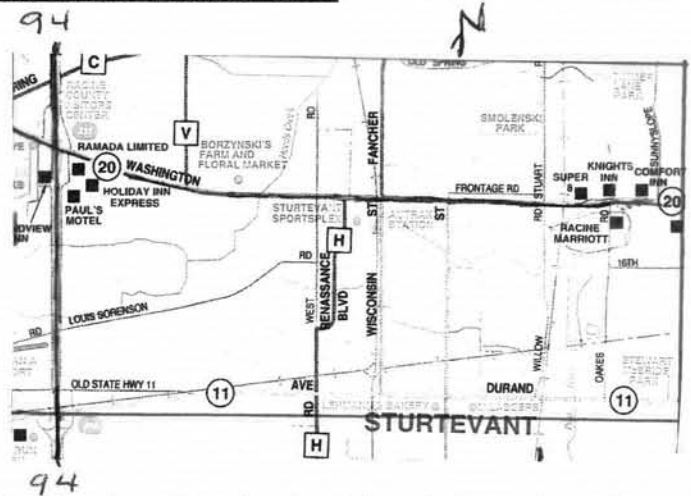
